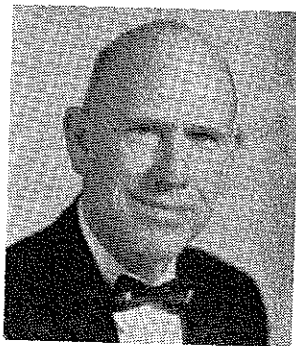

#### CLARE E. DEAN

(Retired Minister)

64, died August 2 at the Flint Osteopathic Hospital. He was born in South Lyon and was a member of a graduate of Albion College and Garrett Theological in Northern High School, Flint, for 28 years, and 26 presented the YMCA work at Northern. Previous to Marshall and Royal Oak. He enlisted as a chaplain in the Detroit Annual Conference and made a difference. #### LUMAN W. BISHOP

(Retired Minister)

69, of Yale, a retired member of the Detroit Annual Conference, died September 18, in Yale Community Hospital after a long illness. He was born in Ontario, Canada, September 24, 1874, the son of Luman W. Bishop, and was associated with the Salvation Army in Michigan in 1908. Mr. Bishop joined the former conference in 1908 and served churches in LaGrange, New Lothrop, Lapeer, Kinde, Riley, Berlin, Good Leonard and Yale. After unification in 1939, he continued his retirement in 1941. He later served at Port Huron at Yale until 1951. He married Elizabeth Kerr in 1900, who died in 1943. In December of 1944 he married Mrs. L. M. Bishop. Other survivors include a daughter, Mrs. L. M. Bishop; two grandchildren; and one great-grandchild. He was buried in the Yale church with Clinton Ball, his pastor, Port Huron District superintendent, officiating. Burial was in Elmwood cemetery.

#### W. P. AINSWORTH

(Retired Minister)

Mr. W. P. Ainsworth, 82, retired member of the Detroit Annual Conference, died August 26, 1966, in Tucson, Arizona. Born August 26, 1883, in England.

he came to the United States when a young man. He joined the Detroit Annual Conference on trial in 1912 and during his active ministry of 44 years served at Sault Ste. Marie, Algonquin, Vulcan, New Haven; Okemos in the Michigan Conference; Grand Blanc, Gaines, Onaway, Denton, Elkton, Fairgrove and Watrousville, Pickford, Crosswell, North Branch, and Harbor Beach. He retired in 1956 and lived in Harbor Beach in the summer and Arizona in the winter. He was unable to come to Michigan this summer. His first wife, Mrs. Ada Ainsworth whom he married in England, died in 1954. He later married Mrs. Ethel Carefoot of Toronto, Canada, who survives. Other survivors include a son, Stanley Ainsworth of Athens, Ga.; a daughter, Mrs. Clifford Jones of Lexington, Ky.; four grandchildren; three stepsons and a stepdaughter. Funeral services were held in First Methodist Church, Harbor Beach, November 2, with the pastor, Merle Nichols, Robert E. McLean of Highland Park and Merton Stevens, Port Huron District superintendent, officiating. Burial took place in Rockfalls Cemetery.

#### N. M. PRITCHARD

(Retired Minister)

Nicholas M. Pritchard, 82, died December 10 at his home in St. Clair Shores from a heart attack. Born May 3, 1883, in Abergavenny, South Wales, he came to the United States in response to a call from the Detroit Annual Conference for English preachers. As an evangelist he began his preaching career in 1903. At 20 he assumed the pastorate of a Congregational Church in Ettington, near Stratford-on-Avon for four years and later held evangelistic meetings in London, Worcester, Oxford and in other parts of England. Coming to Michigan with a group of eight English preachers in 1910, he served Methodist Episcopal churches in both the Michigan and Detroit conferences. He returned to England in the midst of World War I and took charge of the Drayton Park Church, Highbury, London. In pulpits exchanges he preached on four occasions in Wesley's Chapel, known as the "Mecca of Methodism." Mr. Pritchard returned to the United States at the close of the war and re-entered the ministry of The Methodist Church in the Detroit Conference, serving ten churches. After his retirement in 1951, he accepted the mission pastorate of Redeemer Methodist Church in Detroit for five years. The year after he came to America he married a preacher's daughter, Miriam Davies Pritchard from Wales, who survives with one daughter, Ruby, wife of W. Harold Pailthorp of Detroit Mt. Hope Church; and two grandchildren. Memorial services were conducted December 14 by Roland Brooks, pastor of First Church, St. Clair Shores, assisted by Merle D. Broyles, Detroit District superintendent, and Merton Stevens, Port Huron district superintendent. He was buried in the Pine Grove Cemetery at Freeland, where he had served his longest pastorate.

#### IRWIN GRANT DUNLAP

(Retired Minister)

Irwin Grant Dunlap, 42, died December 14 at his Detroit home following a six-year period of ill health which began in 1959 when he suffered a heart attack. Mr. Dunlap was born June 7, 1923, in Detroit, the
