

N. M. PRITCHARD (Retired Minister)

Nicholas M. Pritchard, 82, died December 10 at his home in St. Clair Shores from a heart attack. Born May 3, 1883, in Abergavenny, South Wales, he came to the United States in response to a call from the Detroit conference for English preachers. As an evangelist he began his preaching career in 1903. At 20 he assumed the pastorate of a Congregational Church in Ettington, near Stratford-on-Avon for four years and later held evangelistic meetings in London, Worchester, Oxford and in other parts of England. Coming to Michigan with a group of eight English preachers in 1910, he served Methodist Episcopal churches in both the Michigan and Detroit conferences. He returned to England in the midst of World War I and took charge of the Drayton Park Church, Highbury, London. In pulpit exchanges he preached on four occasions in Wesley's Chapel, known as the "Mecca of Methodism." Mr. Pritchard returned to the United States at the close of the war and re-entered the ministry of The Methodist Church in the Detroit Conference, serving ten churches. After his retirement in 1951, he accepted the mission pastorate of Redeemer Methodist Church in Detroit for five years. The year after he came to America he married a preacher's daughter, Miriam Davies Pritchard from Wales, who survives with one daughter, Ruby, wife of W. Harold Pailthorp of Detroit Mt. Hope Church; and two grandchildren. Memorial services were conducted December 14 by Roland Brooks, pastor of irst Church, St. Clair Shores, assisted by Merle D. Broyles, Detroit District superintendent, and Merton Stevens, Port Huron district superintendent. He was buried in the Pine Grove Cemetery at Freeland, where he had served his longest pastorate.

IRWIN GRANT DUNLAP (Retired Minister)

Irwin Grant Dunlap, 42, died December 14 at his Detroit home following a six-year period of ill health which began in 1959 when he suffered a heart attack. Mr. Dunlap was born June 7, 1923, in Detroit, the
