Rev. F. P. Allender was born October 6, 1852, and departed this life January 26, 1935, age 82 years, 3 months and 20 days.

He was united in marriage with Miss Julia Ann Anderson on

Rev. Allender made a Christian confession early in life and became a United Brethren minister in 1891, and served continuations of the confession and served continuations. ously until 1922, when he retired from active work on account of defective hearing. Although he retired from active ministry he took an active part in the local church work, especially the Sunday School, until his health became too much impaired.

Everywhere he has lived or otherwise been known he is famed for his Christian life and dealings with his fellowmen. Rev. Allender built at least four new churches and bought and paid for one parsonage. He received approximately one thousand members into the U. B. Church during his ministry. He repaired and improved

churches and parsonages wherever he went.
