sion Conference he was appointed Presiding Elder of the Creek District. He was in bad health at that time; soon after was attacked of pneumonia, from which he never recovered. Although his afflictions were great, he was patient, and resigned to the will of his Heavenly Father. His last hours were peaceful and triumphant. He died a little before midnight, June 28, 1867. His remains were buried near the Asbury Mission, Creek Nation, there to sleep till the trump of God shall call him from the grave.
