Report of the Committee on Memorials.

Jacob Boas.

Bro. Boas is dead. His work on earth is finished. He was born in the city of Reading, Berks county, Pa., in the year 1815, and died April 5th, 1884. When a young man he gave his heart to Christ, and was licensed to preach in 1833. He was a man of fine physique, commanding appearance, and excellent natural talent. In the early part of his ministry he gave his intellect the benefit of study and discipline, and was distinguished for his knowledge of the Scriptures and clearness of thought. He went as the first Missionary from our Church to the West. His winning manner and eloquent words won the hearts of those western men and some precious souls were brought to Christ through his personal ministry. For over fifty years Bro. Boas stood identified with the interests of our Church. He attended the annual Conference held in Williamsport March 5th, 1883, for the last time. In the beginning of March, 1884, he died, leaving a wife, weeping children and the Church to mourn his loss.

He was not perfect, or without mistake, and although his body lies in the dreamless grave, we owe it to him and ourselves to keep him in enduring remembrance.

Rev. M. Sloat.

Bro. Sloat was born in York county, Pa., 1828, and licensed to preach at the age of 28 years, and died September, 1884. His first and last charge was Cumberland Circuit, Cumberland county, Pa.

He was a man of great faith, and was earnest, pious, devoted and faithful unto death.

His natural talent, study of the Bible, zeal and holy consecration to his Master, made him a worker that needeth not be ashamed.

On account of his extreme nervousness during his last illness, his physicians advised him not to pray too much.

His reply was, "Why, Doctor, only while I pray, I live." The end came, and the spirit of our beloved Brother was with his God.

His remains were taken to East Prospect, York county, Pa., attended by

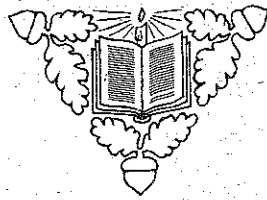
