MRS. MARY BRADSHAW, wife of Rev. J. W. Bradshaw, a superannuated minister of the North Indiana Conference, and daughter of John and Hannah Ferrel, departed this life in Warsaw, Indiana, November 20, 1874. She was born in Washington County, Pennsylvania, September 14, 1804. April 13, 1827, she was united in marriage with her now bereaved husband. The same year she was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church. In the year 1841, she with her husband entered the itinerant ranks.
