



Price M. Collins

September 27, 1907 - January 17, 1999

Price was born in Philadelphia in 1907. He was a student at both Drew University and Temple University, and received his B.S. degree from Temple in 1938. He continued at Temple, earning the S.T.B. in 1939.

He and Ella were married in the late 1930's. They were blessed with three children, two sons and a daughter.

His first appointment, 1936, was at Collingdale. This was followed by Chalfont; Berwyn; Second Church, Easton; Johnson Memorial, Philadelphia; Union Church, Havertown; and in 1955, Olivet Church, Coatesville.

Price was elected to Phi Beta in 1951. His presence at Phi Beta meetings were consistently dependable until they moved to Roanoke, Virginia in the 1980's. Their one son lives in Connecticut and the second son and daughter live in California.

In 1959 Price became Superintendent of the North District (former Philadelphia Conference). His support from the pastors and Church people, in this responsible Conference Office, was outstanding. I remember well, and knew first-hand, his sincere concern for and support of the young men, then advancing in ministry, leading to Ordination and full Conference membership.

in late 1963 Price was named Administrator of Cornwall Manor. He followed Dr. Levi Zerr, the loved and respected founder of Cornwall Manor in 1949, and its first Administrator. It is a matter of record that Price and Levi Zerr directed the growth and development of Cornwall Manor through its first 27 years. The Cornwall Manor of 1999, its 50th Anniversary Year, is a continuing record of the initial years of planning, fund raising, development, the overcoming of great obstacles, and always underscored and strengthened by the commitment to Cornwall, and the continuous prayers and hard work of the dedication of Price, Levi, their successors, and their many associates.

Price had a great career in the ministry, serving with distinction the role of pastor for nearly 25 years. He was loved by the people in Churches he served. He was a "real pastor." However, while most of us knew him as Cornwall Manor Administrator, the depth of his love for the Church and its people always supported and guided him. His administrative leadership was marked by his insistence, in all matters of business and development, that the well-being of Cornwall Manor residents must always be uppermost in all that we do.

Following two years of failing health, on January 17, 1999 Price heard the call of God to enter life eternal. I'm sure he heard the voice of God calling him, "Well done, my good and faithful servant, come and share in My happiness" (Matthew 25:23, "Bible For Today's Family"). His ashes were interred in the Cornwall Church cemetery, beside those of his loved wife, Ella, on January 28, 1999. Theodore Mefford, pastor of Cornwall Church, officiated at the grave-side service.
