he played the piano and led the singing as well as preaching. After leaving the farm in 1942, they lived in Cumberland Presbyterian parsonages, serving several small pastorates in Kentucky, the DeWitt-Fullerton charge and Virginia charge in Illinois, and Allsboro charge in Alabama.

In 1954 he joined the Louisville Conference of the Methodist Church, where in eleven years he served six circuits with four or more churches and one circuit with two churches. In 1965, in order to be closer to their sons, he joined the Central Illinois Conference, completing 48 years of active ministry. Because of ill health, he retired at the 1971 Annual Conference and moved to a house he had built near Decatur, close to his son, Roy.

Lyddia died August 16, 1972. After her death he preached three series of revival services, the last one being at his home church in Kentucky, a little over a month before his death, October 2, 1974.

Memorial services were held in Long Creek United Methodist Church by his pastor, W. Howard Baker, with Dr. Marshall Ervin assisting. He was buried in Point Pleasant Cemetery in Long Creek Township, Macon County, Illinois.
