The second of our brethren to be called home during November was The Rev. Louis C. Schmidt. He departed to receive his eternal reward November 12, 1957 at the age of 83 years. He was united in marriage to Mabel Mohr on December 25, 1897. He attended Oberlin and Knox Colleges and was licensed to preach in 1894. He was ordained Deacon in 1898 and Elder in the year 1900. In all he gave 50 years of distinguished leadership to his church. He served the following fields: Joliet, Cedarville, Polo, Freeport Trinity, Naperville Grace (twice), Kimball Ave, Chicago, The College Church at LeMars, Iowa and Streator. He served as Conference Superintendent for 16 years. He was many times member of General Conference and served many boards and committees of the general church. He passed away at the Haven Hubbard Home. Funeral services were held from Grace Church Naperville with the pastor, Rev. Wilmert H. Wolf in charge, assisted by Dr. Paul V. Church, Dr. Paul H. Eller and Dr. William Grote.

The third of our comrades to lay his armour down during November was The Rev. John F. Sahlin. He passed away on November 28, 1957. He was born July 16, 1885 at Atchinson, Mo. On April 18, 1917 he was united in marriage to Hulda Steiner. They are the parents of one son. Brother Sahlin attended Moody Bible Institute and later took a correspondence course from Evangelical Theological Seminary. In 1917 he was employed by the American Sunday School Union to establish Sunday Schools in Montana. He then was pastor of six churches in the states of Kansas and Oklahoma. He came to Illinois in 1927. Here he was pastor of the following churches: Charlotte-Emmanuel, near Chatsworth, Richland, while pastor here he served Granville several years, Spring Bay. While at Spring Bay he served East Peoria for three years. His retirement came in 1952. He resided in Spring Bay and it was a great joy to him when the building and remodeling of the church there was complete. His wife and son survive.

His pastor, Rev. Dale Ferris was in charge of the memorial service. Dr. O. F.

Landis, Rev. H. O. Zimmerman and Dr. Wm. Grote assisted.

The fourth and last of our co-workers to be called home during November was The Rev. Paul A. Lang. He was born in Minnesota and grew to manhood there. He entered his eternal home on November 30, 1957. He graduated from the Evangelical Theological Seminary (Then Union Biblical Institute) in 1901. He then served 5 churches in the Minnesota Conference. He had much to do with the establishing of the Lake Koronis Camp Ground. He transferred to the Illinois Conference in 1925 and was pastor of the following churches: Peoria Grace, Villa Park, Bonfield-Grand Prairie and Hampshire. He retired in 1947. He is survived by two sons, Harold of Peoria and the Rev. Melvin of our Faith Church, Freeport, and two daughters, Mrs. Melvin Miller and Mrs. John F. Schaefer.

Funeral services were held in Naperville First Church with the pastor, Dr. Paul

Washburn and Dr. Paul Church officiating.

The Rev. William L. Perkins was called to his heavenly home on January 24, 1958 at the age of 83 years. He was joined in marriage to Nettie Brown, who survives. He was a native of Vergennes, Illinois. Brother Perkins was licensed in 1902 and was ordained in 1906. Dr. Perkins was a Conference Superintendent for 11 years and a delegate to General Conference 8 times. He served as trustee of Otterbein Home and also of Indiana Central College. He served on the committee for the merger of the Evangelical and United Brethren Churches. After long service in Illinois he moved to California and was pastor of First Church, Los Angeles. He was Superintendent of the Baker Home for 5 years.

Funeral services were held at Murphysboro with Rev. Earl F. Michaels officiating,

assisted by Rev. L. W. Godert and Rev. Oscar Maerker.

The Rev. Oscar Mehnert was born in Germany on October 11, 1875. He came to America in 1881. He was married to Lillie Huelson on December 21, 1904. Four daughters were born to this union. He was married the second time to Elsie Powell on April 5, 1920. She survives his home going.

Brother Mehnert was pastor of the Manhattan, Jonesboro and Graysville Churches in Illinois. He then transferred to the Iowa Conference and served 5 churches there. He retired in 1923 and lived in Naperville to the time of his death, March

5. 1958.

Dr. Rolland W. Schloerb, age 65, was born in Oskosh, Wisconsin and passed to the better land on March 15, 1958. His wife, the former Edith Grandsen and a son and daughter survive.

Dr. Schloerb was pastor of First Church, Naperville, for seven years after having served as Army Chaplain during World War I. Since 1929 he has been pastor of

the Hyde Park Baptist Church in Chicago.

He was the author of two books, "God in Our Lives" and "The Preaching Ministry Today". He also wrote the exposition of Proverbs for the Interpreters Bible. He maintained his membership in our conference. Memorial services were held in the Hyde Park Church.
