many hours in preparation of these lessons. She was a constant source of help, encouragement and inspiration to her preacher husband. She was very proud of her man, and did everything that she could to support him in his work for The Master.

Rev. Earl Rowe said in his memorial address on May 11, 1970 that Mrs. Fields was a cheerful person, that underneath her cheerfulness, her thoughtfulness of others, her joy in all that makes life lovely, there ran a current of confidence and unhesitating trust in her Saviour. She believed and demonstrated that conscious fellowship with God is the foundation of every strong life — the natural source from which all must derive their power and their peace.

It is in this faith she lived and it is in this faith she died on Friday, May 8, 1970 at Bethany Village, Mechanicsburg, Penna. where she had made her home, after her husband's death.

Memorial Services were held in The Camp Hill United Methodist Church on Monday, May 11, 1970 with Dr. Earl N. Rowe, her Pastor and her nephew, the Rev. H. Richard Welliver officiating at the Service.

Interment was held at the I.O.O.F. Cemetery in Mount Union with the Rev. Norman Marden in charge.

### MARION VAN HORN FRAY

Marion Van Horn Fray was born, the only daughter of three children, to Myrtle Campbell Van Horn and the late Harry C. Van Horn, on October 1, 1912 in the little village of Register on the Town Hill Parish in Huntington Township, Pennsylvania.

Upon graduating from the Huntington Township schools, she entered the State College at Bloomsburg to prepare for a career in teaching. Beginning in the one-room school at Southdale in her home parish, she had completed almost twenty-one years of teaching, when stricken while on duty in the elementary school at Jersey Shore. Nine of these years were taught in the Mainville school.

On December 29, 1936, Marion was united in holy matrimony with the Reverend Alfred C. Fray, then pastor of the Harveyville Charge of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with Dr. Allen C. Shue, District Superintendent, and the Reverend G. C. Spurr, the bride's pastor officiating.

Kindly affectioned, pleasing in personality, having a great love for children, sympathetic and understanding—Marion was by nature and training able to make a real contribution to the Kingdom as she served faithfully for thirty-three years as a devoted companion to her minister husband. A member of her church said, "Any parish that is privileged to have Marion Fray in it's parsonage is truly blessed."

"My own, my love and I shall have so much to share together

Marion was an active member of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, the Pennsylvania State and National Education Associations.

She died Sunday March 1, 1970 in the Jersey Shore Hospital where she had been taken that morning. Services were held March 5, 1970 from her home church at Register with Dr. Grantas Hoopert, Superintendent of the Williamsport District, and Reverend William L. Price, pastor of the Town Hill Church officiating. Interment was in Dodson Cemetery at Southdale.
