CLOAY M. DEPUTY, daughter of James and Martha Deputy, was born on December 31, 1882, in Jennings County, Indiana, and died at Sac City, Iowa, on June 28, 1965, at the age of 82 years, 5 months and 27 days.

She was married on February 16, 1902, to Jacob W. Gruber, who later became a Methodist minister. After serving in the Indiana and the Northern Minnesota Conferences, they transferred to the Iowa Conference in 1926 where they served Eddyville, Oxford-North Liberty, Milton, Letts, Wilton Junction, Allerton, Lanesboro, and Carson-Spring Creek before retiring in 1943.

Three children were born to these parents. Mrs. Gruber attracted a wide circle of friends throughout their ministry and in their retirement at Lake City, Iowa. Besides her loving care of her children and husband, she was always active in the work of the church as long as health permitted. Her husband preceded her in death October 8, 1950.

Death came after a brief illness on June 28 at the Loring Hospital in Sac City. Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Florence Lenore Maloy of Columbus, Ohio; two sons, Maurice D. Gruber of Sac City, Iowa, and Loren W. Gruber of Baltimore, Maryland; six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Services were held in the Trinity Methodist Church, Lake City, Iowa, on June 30, 1965, with the pastor, Rev. Carl O. Jensen in charge. Burial was in the Oakland Cemetery, Sac City, Iowa.

ROY E. GRAVES was born in Welcome, Minnesota, on December 19, 1886. He moved to South Dakota when he was 12 years old, grew up in Clark, South Dakota, where from the Methodist Church there he gave himself to the ministry of the Gospel of his Christ.

He graduated from Dakota Wesleyan where he met and married Prudence Hersey of Conde, South Dakota, in 1914.

In 1929 he graduated from Drew Theological Seminary and then served pastorates in South Dakota at Bristol, Timber Lake, Langford, White, Egan, Aurora, Elkton, Murdo and Okaton. He later served a church at Millersburg, Iowa, from which he retired. At that time he moved to Beloit, Wisconsin, to live and there served as part-time parish visitor for the First

Methodist Church. Here he and his wife celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary on June 17, 1964.

After 10 years and failing health, he moved to Frenchburg, Kentucky, where his doctor son lives.

On July 27, 1965, he passed from this life. Funeral services were held in Frenchburg, Kentucky. He is survived by his wife, Prudence, two sons and two daughters all of whom are in Christian service.
