EDWARD HARMAN.

Was born near Box Iron, Worcester county, Maryland, May 15, 1826. Was married when quite a young man to one Miss Sarah Ann Rowley. To them were born twelve children. The wife and six children passed on before him. He was converted and joined the Methodist Church at the age of 22 years, 1848. In 1864 he was licensed as an Exhorter by the Rev. Isaiah Broughton, who was the first pastor of the old Pocomoke Circuit of the Delaware Conference, and in 1865 was licensed a Local Preacher by Rev. Wilmore S. Elsey, the first Presiding Elder. So for 36 years he filled the office of Local Preacher. He was in failing health for about two years, but never broke up his home till March, 1901. Then in the home of his youngest son, Charles E. Harman, he waited till Sunday, May 5th, when the end came, and he was gone. He leaves 6 children, 31 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren. He was an earnest advocate of the cause, being for many years a Prohibitionist, and would speak fearlessly his convictions.
