MEMORIAL OF NELSON FARROR.

Nelson Farror was born in the year 1804. He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church until the year 1865, when he joined A. M. E. Church, and remained a member of it until the year 1871, at which time he joined the Methodist Episcopal Conference on credentials. He was appointed to Oberlin in 1872; in 1874, to Raleigh; in 1875—78, to Love Hill; in 1879 to '86 he was superannuated. During his aged and feeble state, he continued his fervent devotion to his Lord and Master.

He lingered in frail health until January last, when he passed quietly to his home beyond the river. He leaves a loving wife and several children to mourn their loss. Sister Farror has our sympathies in her sad be-reavement, and we pray Him who, in His judgment, is too wise to err, and too good to be unkind, to strengthen her by His unfailing grace until she and children shall meet with him again where parting is no more.
