REV. BARNABAS HITCHCOCK, father of Rev. P. Hitchcock, of Troy Conference, died at St. Armand, C. E., Oct. 12, aged 80. He was a native of Vermont, but removed with his father to Canada when a boy. He was awakened under the ministry of Rev. Hezekiah C. Wooster, and converted at the age of sixteen. In 1811 he became an exhorter, and in 1823 a local preacher. Removing to Vermont he entered the itinerant ministry. After traveling three years he returned to Canada. He lived four years in Montreal, and took an active part in a remarkable revival there. He afterward labored some years in the mission work. He was an active, energetic man, and an earnest, useful preacher. He died in peace. J. ARMSTRONG.
