BALTIMORE, MD., March 10, 1943.

The Commission on Ministerial Relief of the Central Pa. Conference con-  
vened at the Faith Evangelical Church at 7:00 p.m. Rev. G. C. Gabriel,  
president, presided.

Rev. W. J. Dice led in prayer. The minutes were read for information.

Weaver, H. W. Shaffer, W. J. R. Rein, and W. F. Snelbaker.

Rev. F. H. Sanders, treasurer of the commission, gave his annual report.  
The report was received and referred to the auditing committee. We recom-  
mend that the distribution of funds for the year 1943 shall be on the basis of  
90% with an extra allowance up to 5% to be paid if the condition of the fund  
will allow said payment at the end of the year.
