REV. CHARLES EDWARD WILLSON-1891-1966

The Reverend Charles E. Willson, son of the late George W. and Sarah (Craven) Willson, was born in Reading, Pennsylvania on November 16, 1891. He was a superannuated minister of the Eastern Conference and resided in Douglassville, R. D. 2 Pennsylvania at the time of his death. In spite of a limiting heart condition for several years, he maintained active involvement in the life of his Lord's Church. After a period of hospitalization he was called from this life on November 20, 1966.

He was recommended for the ministry by Immanuel Church, Reading, and received his license to preach in 1911. His formal education was gained from Schuvikill Seminary. In 1915 he was ordained and received into the itinerancy. Through the years he served eight charges: Wyomissing, 1913-1915, 1917-1918; Ephrata, 1915-1916; Paradise Circuit, 1918-1922; Fall River, Massachusetts, 1922-1924; Somerville, Massachusetts, 1925-1934; Pawtucket, Rhode Island, 1934-1940; Cambridge, Rhode Island, 193 chusetts, 1940-1949; Hegins and Muir, 1949-1958. In 1958 he was granted superannuated relationship.

Through these years of rich service to Christ's Church he shared his many experiences of joy and evangelistic concern with his companion and helpmate, Alice From this marriage has come two daughters: Sarah A., wife of the Rev. Frederick J. Ohms, Brooklyn, New York; and Miriam E., wife of Mark E. Walter of Douglassville; and four sons: The Rev. C. Wesley Willson of Wrightsville; Paul E. Willson of Lincoln, Rhode Island; The Rev. John F. Willson of Warminster; and David B. of Enola. He is survived by his wife, these children, twelve grandchildren and two sisters.

During his twenty-seven years of service in New England the Rev. Mr. Willson gave leadership to many areas of conference life. He was pastor-superintendent for twelve years in the former New England Conference. He attended General Conference three times, twice as a delegate and once as an alternate delegate. He was a trustee of Albright College for sixteen years.

He served on many conference boards and committees. He was Director of Christian Education for two terms pioneering in the area of leadership education through the Silver Lake Camp Meeting. He was vitally interested in the area of missions serving the conference board of missions for twenty-one years, first as secretary and later as treasurer. For five years he was conference secretary and editor and publisher of the Conference Journal.

During his retirement he became actively engaged as a parish visitor on the staff of the Inner City Parish, Reading, formed through a merger of his home church, Immanuel, with Zion. He served as a teacher in the Church School and ministered to the many needs of his friends.

His evangelistic fervor and his love for the reading of the Scriptures never flagged. With great enthusiasm he would share some new insight into God's Word, and with genuine warmth and concern he spoke to others of the call to commitment by Christ. This servant of our Lord, even during moments of physical crisis; testified to the hope and confidence which were his in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The funeral service was held in the Gibson and Sanders Funeral Home, Reading, Pennsylvania, on November 23, 1966. The Reverend James S. Royer gave the meditation and the Reverend George W. Bashore read the Scripture and offered the prayers. Interment was at Fairview Cemetery in Shillington, Pennsylvania.

REV. SAMUEL AUSTIN MILLER—1894-1966

The Rev. Samuel A. Miller, a retired minister of our Eastern Conference fellowship, entered into his eternal rest on Christmas Day of 1966. He was age 72 and resided at 744 North Railroad Street, Palmyra, Pennsylvania. His death followed four weeks of hospitalization.

He served in the active ministry for 43 years prior to his retirement in 1958 as the result of ill health. The Rev. Mr. Miller served as pastor of Bethany E.U.B.

Church, Palmyra between 1937 and 1944.

A native of Armstrong County, he was licensed to preach in 1915 and ordained in 1921. He was graduated in 1919 from Albright College, when it was located in Myerstown. He was also graduated from Lancaster Theological Seminary.

From 1923 to 1937 he served churches in Western Pennsylvania. Following the Palmyra pastorate he served Albright Church, Sunbury, until 1952, from then until his retirement in 1958 was pastor of Calvary Church, Philadelphia.

He was a member of Bethany Church, Palmyra, the Men's Bible Class and the

Palmyra Area Council of Churches.

Surviving are his wife, the former Ruth Shirey; two sons, The Rev. Newell A. Miller, Kingston, Tenn., and Samuel A. Miller, Jr., Public School Administrator, Allentown, Pa., and six daughters, Jean, wife of Mark Z. Ferry, and Miriam, wife of Carl C. Moyer, both of Palmyra; Helen, wife of Leroy Yeatts, Kingston, Tenn.; Aldine, wife of Abraham W. Longenecker, and Charlotte, wife of M. Eugene Haver, both of Manheim and Joan, wife of William S. Scott, Heidelberg, Germany.

Also surviving are 27 grandchildren. He was the son of the late Christ and

Susan Mauk Miller.

Memorial services were conducted in Bethany Church by his pastor, The Rev. Lester C. Updegrove. The sermon was delivered by a former Conference Superintendent, The Rev. Dr. Carl M. Schneider of Linglestown, Pa. under whom Rev. Miller served the Calvary Church, Philadelphia. Interment was held in the Grandview Memorial Park, Annyille, Pa.

THE REV. PAUL EARL FRIDINGER-1897-1966

The Reverend Paul Earl Fridinger, son of the Reverend William Wesley and Clara Estella Frank Fridinger, was born at Hopeland, Penna., July 10th, 1897 and after many years of faithful service to Christ and the Church, he was suddenly called from his home at Mount Gretna, Penna, to his Eternal Home in Glory, Thursday, December 29th at the age of 69 years, 5 months, and 19 days.

Our brother beloved had the good fortune to be reared in a United Brethren Parsonage where the family altar brought rich blessings to all. Here with his brothers and sisters he learned the lessons of honesty, industry and piety. While in his young and tender years, he opened his heart to the word of God which made him wise unto salvation. Throughout his life he studied and preached the Word, obeyed its commands, lived its ideals, reflected its glory and claimed its promises until the Voice

of the Living Word said, "well done."

Following the footsteps of his Father and his older Brother, this son Paul heard and answered the call to the Christian Ministry. He was recommended for his Quarterly Conference License by the Jonestown Church in 1915. Believing a willingness to prepare was an evidence of a call he entered Lebanon Valley College. In the year 1927 he was granted his Annual Conference License, and in 1932 upon completion of the Conference Study Course and additional studies at the Lancaster Theological Seminary, he was ordained at the Annual Conference held at State Street Church, Harrisburg, Penna. by Bishop G. D. Batdorf, Ph.D., D.D., LL.D., assisted by Conference Superintendent Dr. S. C. Enck and Dr. H. E. Miller.

Reverend Fridinger was united in marriage to Miss Norene Heilman of Jonestown, Pa., on July 15, 1916, with his father, Reverend W. W. Fridinger officiating.

To this union were born three children, Evelyn wife of Mr. Harvey Baker, Paxtang; Arlene, now deceased; and Myrtle, wife of George S. Gardner, Belvidere, N. J. He also leaves to mourn his loss four grandchildren, a brother and a sister.
