In the Los Angeles Conference he supplied Mateo Street, Los Angeles, in 1893. In 1894 he was readmitted and stationed at Newport. He served Lompoc, 1895; Santa Paula, 1896; San Diego, 1897; Escondido and Valley Center, 1898. In 1901 he took the supernumerary relation and in 1911 he was superannuated. For the past thirty years he lived in Santa Ana. Brother Perry was married three times. He was married to Charlotte E. Carr December 20, 1876. She died September 11, 1892, at Moneta, I have no record of his second marriage. During his pastorate at Valley Center he met Mrs. Electa P. Davis and they were later married. By a former marriage, he leaves two daughters, Miss Sue Perry and Mrs. A. M. Davis, and two sons, W. C. and R. B. Perry. His wife lingered five weeks after his going.-Moffett Rhodes.

CHARLES ADDISON REXROAD, son of Zachariah T. and Rebecca Scott Rexroad, was born August 22, 1879, and died March 4, 1934, in Sacramento, Calif. Early in his youth his family moved to Missouri, where he was educated in the grammar and high schools, and licensed to preach in June, 1898. He was married to Zona Bridges on May 10, 1903, and unto them were born five children: Charles Clarence, Lucile, and George F. Rexroad, who survive him; twin girls, Thelma and Velma, who died in infancy. His first pastorate in the Northwest was at Harrisburg, Oreg., where he also served as the principal of the high school. At Roseburg, his next pastorate, he also taught. He attended Morrisville College in Missouri, where he took his bachelor's degree, and later secured his master's degree from Ardmore College in Oklahoma. He served Milton, Oreg., Butte, Mont., Corvallis, Oreg., and Butte, Mont. While serving Butte the second time he joined the United States Army as first lieutenant and chaplain, and was transferred to the 91st Division and sent overseas. He was promoted to a captaincy, and made the senior chaplain and chief burial officer. That fall he went to Siloam Springs, Ark., where he was dean of John Brown College for a year.
