THE REV. S. EDWIN RUPP

The Rev. S. Edwin Rupp passed away Saturday, May 23, 1964, at Ocean Springs, Mississippi. He was born at Harrisburg, Pa., Sept. 9, 1878. He received his B.A., M.S., and honorary D.D. degrees from the Lebanon Valley College; and his B.D. degree from the Ursinus College of Theology.

During his ministry he served the following churches: Trinity Church, Lebanon, Pa.; First Church, Westerville, Ohio; and Lakewood, Lakewood, Ohio. He was pastor of the Lakewood Church for 17 years, 1927-1944. He retired from active work in 1944.

He is survived by his wife, Jessie Brane Rupp; one daughter, Mrs. W. J. Huey; and one grandson, all of Ocean Springs, Mississippi. Burial was made at Hagerstown, Maryland.
