JACOB LOWE SHIVELY

Jacob Lowe Shively died suddenly at his home in Knoxville, Illinois, August the 8th. He was born near Smithton, Pennsylvania, September 14th, 1855. He was graduated from Ohio Wesleyan in 1882 In 1880 he was licensed as a local preacher by the quarterly conference at St. Paul's Church, Delaware, Ohio. In 1882 he entered the Boston University School of Theology, and in 1884 he was received into the Cincinnati Conference. In 1906 he transferred to the Central Illinois Conference and served in its bounds until

hais retired to the Central Illinois Conference and served in its bounds until his retirement in 1928. During his Illinois pastorates, he served on the Board of Trustees of Hedding College and of the Methodist Hospital at Peoria.

In 1888, November 21st, Mr. Shively was married to Clara E. Morris of Hamilton, Ohio. Six children were born, of whom four survive their father: Harriet Shively of Knoxville, Illinois; Mrs. Mary Lou Knight and Mrs. Margaret Leggette, both of Detroit, Michigan; and Lieut. Morris Lowe Shively, United States Marine Corps, Quantico, Virginia.

During the years of his retirement, Mr. Shively retained a very active interest in the affairs of the church. He was an energetic helper in the work of the local parish, as a Church School teacher and leader in the Missionary work of the church.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist Episcopal Church of Knoxville, by the Pastor, the Rev. Walter F. Day, the sermon being delivered by the Rev. T. E. Newland of Galesburg. Burial was in the Knoxville

ROBERT L. STEED

Robert L. Steed, son of Henry and Amanda Steed was born in Randolph County, North Carolina, June 1, 1862. He came with his parents to Illinois at the age of five.

He departed this life December 1, 1932, at his home in Mt. Sterling,

He was converted in his early youth and from that time on was sincerely and genuinely religious. His "I KNOW" gave a tremendous power to his ministry.

He was graduated from Chaddock College and later in 1893 from Drew Theological Seminary. His entire ministry was in the Illinois Conference. He served many years as Registrar and held some of the longest pastorates of the Conference,

He was married to Alice Marshall in 1889. She and two sons, Howard, Detroit, Mich., and Dr. E. G. Steed, Peoria, Ill., survive. The funeral was held at Mt. Sterling. Dr. H. W. McPherson preached the sermon.

He was buried at Griggsville, Illinois.

WILLIAM H. WITTER

William H. Witter was born in Stark County, Illinois, May 18, 1848, and died in Rock Island, Illinois, July 26, 1933.

He was educated at Hedding and Knox Colleges and at Northwestern University, becoming a student at the University shortly after its founding.

On September 11, 1873 he was united in marriage with Miss Matilda Bestor of Abingdon, Illinois, who preceded him in death. To this union two children were born; Mrs. Mae W. Hendrickson of Denver, Colorado, and James F. Witter of Rock Island, Illinois. These, with two grandsons survive.

On entering the ministry in the Central Illinois Conference he was appointed to Pink Prairie, later serving the following charges: Osco, Reynolds, Oneida, Bardolph, Roseville, Keithsburg, Cambridge and Farmington. He was retired from the active ministry in 1915 on account of age. His longest pastorates were at Cambridge where he built both church and parsonage and Roseville where he built the parsonage. Brother Witter was a faithful pastor and a successful evangelist. His pastorates were characterized by large additions to the church through conversion.
