ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

OF THE PREACHERS' AID SOCIETY OF THE NORTH-WEST INDIANA CONFERENCE, METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH.

WE, the undersigned, believing that some better method is necessary to provide for the wants of superannuated itinerant preachers, and the widows and orphans of deceased preachers, do hereby form ourselves into a charitable association for the purpose above named, and hereby adopt the following Articles of Association:

ARTICLE I. This Association shall be known by the name and title of "The Preachers' Aid Society of the North-west Indiana Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in the United States of America."

ARTICLE II. Any person may become a member of this Association by the payment annually of the sum of from one dollar to thirty dollars, as the managers may from time to time agree upon as the terms of membership.

ARTICLE III. The object of this Association shall be to collect, by subscription, donation, bequest, or otherwise, a permanent fund, to be invested, and the interest or proceeds accruing therefrom to be applied for the support of superannuated itinerant preachers, and the widows and orphans of deceased preachers of the North-west Indiana Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
