Memoirs.

REV. WILLIAM TRIPP.

Commencing his race with the century, he has a little outstripped it and won the crown. After laboring some time as a Local Preacher and two years in the Mohawk valley under the P. E. he joined the traveling connection at Watertown in 1836, thus beginning his itinerant career with the beginning of the Black River Conference. Counting the two years of real itinerant work under the elder, he performed *thirty* years of pastoral service, and few pastors excelled him in the skill and diligence with which he did the kind of work specially termed Pastoral. The geniality of his nature, the piety of his heart, the christian courtesy of his manner, the dignity of his appearance, and above all his perseverance and zeal, made him an eminent pastor; and everywhere cordially received to the homes of his people as their faithful shepherd and friend. At times he had marked success as a revivalist; in other charges his great work was to build up; and in others to settle difficulties and prepare the way for his successors to gather in by sweeping revivals. At one of his appointments, a boy, unaccustomed to attend religious meetings, came in while he was preaching and in his confusion dropped into the seat in the desk. But if the boy was nonplussed the preacher was not, for laying his fatherly hand upon the frightened lad's head, brother Tripp lovingly expressed the hope, that "one day he would fill the sacred desk more ably and usefully than he had!" And from that day this boy cherished an interest in religious things; grew up to become a gospel minister; ran a short race, and preceding brother Tripp to heaven, perhaps waited to welcome him.

The fields of labor occupied by William Tripp during the thirty years of his active ministry were, Russia, Carthage, Theresa, Cape Vincent, Washingtonville, Hopkinton, Theresa, again, Depeyster, McComb, Three Mile Bay, Henderson, Smithville, Rodman, Pillar Point, Brownville, Haron, Pamela, LaFargeville, Sandy Creek and Mannsville.

In 1864 he retired as a worn soldier to camp superannuate, where, during that calm evening of life, he matured his graces, and in a good old age, passed away in triumph; and the noble form so long familiar in our annual gatherings, was reverently laid away in a Western grave,

"Where he sleeps like a warrior taking his rest
With his martial cloak around him."
