ARTHUR FREDERICK UPHOFF

September 2, 1884—June 16, 1949



Arthur Frederick Uphoff was born at Richview, Illinois. He was educated at German Wallace College and Nast Theological Seminary, Berea, Ohio. He was received on trial into the East German Conference in 1912 and into full connection in 1915. He was united in marriage with Emma R. Uphoff in 1911 and to this union three children were born: Rev. Robert A. Uphoff, C. Wallace Uphoff, and Violet Rose Baker. Following the death of his wife in 1944, he was united in marriage in 1946 to Frieda Wanner.

He served the following charges: Wellsville, N. Y., and Elizabeth, N. J., in the East German Conference; Bland and Hermon, Missouri, in the St. Louis German Conference; South Milford, Spencerville, Arcola, Hamilton, and Orville in the North Indiana Conference; Prospect St., Marion, St. Paul's, Toledo, and St. Paul's, Cleveland, in the Central German Conference. While at St. Paul's, the Central German Conference merged with 16 other Conferences and he joined the North-East Ohio Conference and served Strongsville, Perry, Streetsboro, Killbuck, Dalton, and East Canton. During his last appointment he led the church from a three point circuit to a station and during the last year led the congregation in a \$10,000 remodeling program which included a new Baldwin organ.

Funeral services were conducted at the Mt. Tabor Methodist Church, East Canton, by Dr. James H. Sivard of Elyria. Burial was in the Wooster Cemetery, Wooster, Ohio.

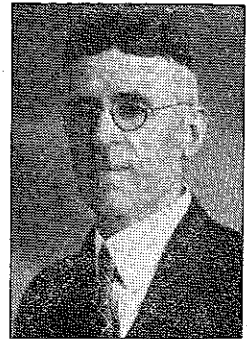
EDGAR HAGA WARNER

September 22, 1868—May 21, 1949

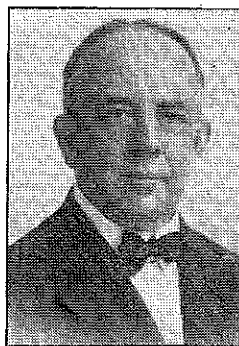
Edgar Haga Warner was born at Trenton, Ohio. He studied at Ohio Wesleyan University Preparatory School and graduated from Baldwin University and Harvard University. On May 1, 1895, he married Louie Sperry, and to this union two children were born, E. Gordon Warner and Lilan Warner Boyle.

He was admitted on trial into the North Ohio Conference in 1892 and in 1895 was received into full connection. He served the following appointments: Birmingham, Penfield, Rocky River, Oberlin, Wesley-Massillon, Brooklyn Memorial-Cleveland, Pennsylvania Avenue-East Liverpool, Barberton First, Tiffin, Cadiz, Mineral City, Bellevue, Cortland, and Bowerston. He retired in 1937.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. E. T. English, Dr. H. J. Thompson, and Dr. Vernon W. Wagar at Vermilion, Ohio. Burial was at Maple Grove Cemetery, Vermilion.

**WILLIAM B. WINTERS**

May 24, 1868—August 23, 1948



William B. Winters, son of Rev. Isaiah S. Winters, who for many years was an honored member of the East Ohio and North-East Ohio Conferences, and Mary Winters, was born May 24, 1868. He was graduated from Ohio Wesleyan University with Phi Beta Kappa honors, and was made a Doctor of Divinity by Mount Union College. In 1891 he was received on trial and into full connection in 1893, giving 45 years of service in the Methodist ministry.

He served the following appointments: Andover, Saybrook, Woodlawn Avenue-Cleveland, Painesville, Cambridge First, Warren First, Canton District, Elyria, Coshoc-ton, Brooklyn Memorial-Cleveland, South Euclid, Bay Village. He took the retired relationship in 1936. He was a trustee of Ohio Wesleyan University, the Methodist Home for Aged in Cincinnati, the Elyria Home for Aged, and the North-East Ohio Conference.

He was always strong in the pulpit, giving great care to his preparation. The financial interests of the church
