

Bishop D. T. Gregory

When last December 27 a highway accident near Cambridge, Ohio instantly took the lives of both Bishop and Mrs. David T. Gregory, two of the most gracious spirits in our Evangelical United Brethren fellowship were snatched away from active service among us. Their mutual devotion to each other, and their service together in the Church made it seem appropriate, however tragic, that they should depart together.

Bishop Gregory served as Vice President of the Board and Chairman of the Department of Home Missions and Church Extension from 1950-1956. Bishop Gregory served the church in his early ministry as pastor, conference superintendent, and college president. In 1937 the General Conference of the United Brethren Church elected him Secretary of the Council of Administration which position he filled until the united Church elevated him to the office of Bishop in 1950. He was a churchman who served each office with honor and distinction.

Rev. F. W. Huebner

Frederick W. Huebner was born January 8, 1875 at Forest Junction, Wisconsin and passed away September 12, 1956 at the home of his daughter in Wilmette,

He was licensed in 1896 by the Wisconsin Conference and was ordained in 1900. His preparatory training was received at North Central College and Ohio State University.

The first 19 years of his 61 years of service were given in the pastoral ministry in Washington County, Plymouth, Butternut Mission, Lomira Circuit, Tabor Church in Milwaukee and Sheboygan. He served 5 years in the superintendency on the former Eau Clair and Madison Districts; 18 years as superintendent of the Flat Rock Children's Home in Ohio, and the closing 5 years of his active service at Brodhead. Rev. Huebner also represented our Conference as delegate to the General Conference of 1915-1917.

On May 4, 1897 he was united in marriage to Rosa Peisker, who at the time of his death survived with one daughter, Clara, (Mrs. Walter F. Schur) of Wilmette, Ill. One brother, August of Forest Junction also survives.

Rev. Frank E. Warren

Frank Eastwood Warren was born April 18, 1878 in Adams County, Wis. and passed away at his home in Oswego, Ill. January 24, 1957 at the age of 78. Rev. Warren served as a supply preacher for a while and then served as pastor at Fennimore and Boscobel for the United Brethren Church. He became a member of the Wisconsin Conference in 1905 and served pastorates at Cascade and Lima Center, Wis.; Mead, Colorado, New Auburn, West Lima, Bloomer, Viola and Cascade for the third time, in Wis. He retired in 1948 from active service. He was united in marriage to Miss Belle Stevens on January 21, 1899 in South Wayne, Wis. Mrs. Warren survives with two daughters, Mrs. Harold Van Etten and Mrs. Donald Corrick of Oswego, Ill., two sons, Richard of Phoenix, Ariz. and Frank of Perto Rico; 12 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren.

Rev. G. A. Bailey

The Rev. G. A. Bailey was born June 14, 1888 in Richland County, Wis. and died at Rice Lake, Wis. on May 2, 1957. He was ordained to the ministry in the Christian Church in 1915, serving congregations in that denomination until 1931 when he was received into the itineracy of the United Brethren Church. He served the following churches in the Wisconsin Conference: Viola and Bloomer. Because of poor health he retired from active service in 1955 and moved to Rice Lake, Wis.

Rev. Mr. Bailey was married to Mae Burns on May 6, 1908. This union was blessed with two children. He is survived by his wife, one son and one daughter.


