Government of India.
"I take the liberty also of asking that you request each missionary to acknowle be receipt of the document so that you may have on record the fact that each Certificate reache, the person for

#### Mrs. Karl E. Anderson

The Division has received word of the death of Mrs. Karl E. Anderson, retired missionary to India, on April 27, 1963.

Emma Mardle Anderson was born on February 18, 1878 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. She graduated from Cornell College, Mt. Vernon, Iowa, and on October 23, 1903 she was married to Karl E. Anderson in Manila, Philippine Islands. From there they went on to India where Mr. Anderson was engaged in evangelistic work, being one of the famous "Twelve Apostles" recruited by Bishop Thoburn. In 1909 the Andersons returned to the United States and following furlough withdrew temporarily from missionary service. They were reinstated in the year 1913, and until 1931 they worked in Kolar, Bangalore and Bidar. They were retired on June 1, 1932. Mr. Anderson died on September 5, 1946.

We express grateful appreciation for Mrs. Anderson's contribution to the Cause of Christ and His Church, and in this hour of parting we feel sure that the surviving children will find strength in the triumph of our Lord over death.

Executive Committee Minutes May 1, 1963.

Jesse Hayes Baldwin was born on February 9, 1877 in Ada, Kansas. He was educated at Kansas Wesleyan University and received his M.D. degree from Kansas University Medical School. On December 7, 1906 he left the United States for service in Taianfu, China. In 1914 he was married to Gertrude Driesback who had been serving as a missionary of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society in the Philippines.

The Division expresses gratitude for the twenty-one years of effective service given by Dr. Baldwin to medical missionary work in China.

### Euston Edgar Clements

The death of Rev. Euston Edgar Clements on October 4, 1962 has been reported to the Division. Mr. Clements rendered 42 years of service as a missionary in Cuba under the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South. He went to the field in 1901 and was retired on June 15, 1943.

Euston Edgar Clements was born on March 5, 1876 in Montgomery Co., Georgia.
