Dies At Woodburn
On 84th Birthday??

AUBURN, Ky. (Spl) — Miss Eunice Fletcher Andrew, Methodist missionary to South America for 30 years, died today on her 84th birthday at Yadon Nursing Home, Woodburn.

A native of Warren County, born Aug. 8, 1872, she was a daughter of the late Benjamin and Sallie Crenshaw Andrew.

The body will be at Blewitt and Dawson Funeral Home here until services at 3 p.m. (CDT) Thursday at Auburn Methodist Church. The Rev. Dewitt Milliken and the Rev. Sam Miller are to officiate, and burial will be in Auburn Cemetery.

Surviving are a brother, J. T. Andrew Sr., Auburn; three nieces, Mrs. J. D. Kunkel, Auburn; Mrs. A. E. Brauch, Cincinnati, and Mrs. Christy Bryant, Dallas, Texas; two nephews, J. T. Andrew Jr., Auburn and Finley Smartt, Memphis.

Miss Etta Mae Andrew

Miss Etta Mae Andrew missionary in Brazil for thirty years. She was born at Rockfield, Kentucky, August 10, 1872 and died August 8, 1956, at Woodburn, Kentucky.

Miss Andrew received her education at Logan College, Russellville, Kentucky, where she was graduated. She sailed for Brazil in September 1907, and remained in missionary service there until April 1937. Throughout the years she gave beautiful and effective service.

She founded Colegio Centenario at Santa Maria, Brazil, and directed its growth and development, with the exception of furloughs, until her retirement. She is remembered for the contribution she made to the advancement of education in Brazil, and was much loved by the many pupils whose lives were enriched through her influence.

The last years of her life were spent at the Rockford Rest Home in Nashville, Tennessee, and Yadon Nursing Home, Woodburn, Kentucky. Funeral services were held August 9, 1956, at the Auburn Methodist Church, Auburn, Kentucky.
