Miss Ashbaugh, Japan Music Teacher, Passes

Miss Adella Margaret Ashbaugh, for thirty-five years a missionary of the  
Methodist Church in Japan, died at Columbus, Ohio, on February 9.

Born in Lancaster, Ohio, September 19, 1873, Miss Ashbaugh received her  
A.B. degree from Baldwin University in 1896. She graduated from Epworth Evangelical  
Theological Institute in 1904 and from Ohio Wesleyan Conservatory in 1914. She was a qualified  
musician spending many months of every furlough studying with leading musicians in  
the United States.

Miss Ashbaugh sailed for Japan on October 6, 1908 and was appointed to  
Kwassui College at Nagasaki in which institution she served until November 10, 1920  
when the order came for all missionaries to leave Japan. Her long service in the college  
enabled her to build up a music department which not only produced artists, but  
also provided teachers of music for many schools in Japan.

Miss Ashbaugh retired from active service on January 1, 1943 after twenty-one  
years of splendid service in Japan.

Her long tenure in one college enabled her to build up a music department which not only produced artists but also provided teachers of music for many schools in Japan. A charming conversationalist, a loyal and true friend, Miss Ashbaugh was above all a devout missionary with a strong and beautiful faith that carried her through many trying and difficult situations.

Miss Ashbaugh retired from active service on January 1, 1943, after thirty-five years of splendid service in Japan.
