This verse of the old hymn always seems appropriate when thinking has her of one of God's dear children who have given of their best to the master.

Her first appointment in India was at the WKKKK Welesley Girls' Schoolwith Miss Rue Sellers in charge, at Naini Tal in the Himalayan mountatains. Returning to India, after furlough, she was appointed to the Calcuita Girls' High School with Miss Daisy Wood and in 1920 was transfered to the WXXXXX English Girls' High School, in Rangoon ,Burma. Failing health caused her meturn to America after a short term in Burma and in 1926 was officially retired.

For a time, she lived with relatives in Washington State and in 1935 she came to California. For a short period, shes at Thoburn Terrace doing some nursing, after which she took an appartment in the home of a friend in Alhambra, and was still living with her till she had a stroke in early February this year and was taken to the local Hozpital where on Feb.7 she passed away.

In writing about Miss Ashwill, I wish I might have known her when she was growing up. This I do know that she became a young woman of very high pronciples with a great desire to serve her Master and help her girls to be come their best for the Master.
