

BERRY, BISHOP JOSEPH

**Preachers and Religious Instructors at
Chautauqua, N. Y., in 1913**

Bishop Joseph F. Berry, Philadelphia Sermon, June 29. Born Alymer, Canada, 1856; educated at Milton Academy, Ontario; D.D. Lawrence University, 1898; LL.D. Cornell College, Ia., 1904; Syracuse University 1905. Pastor of Methodist Churches in Michigan 1874-90; Associate Editor Michigan Christian Advocate 1884-90; Editor Epworth Herald 1890-1904; Bishop since 1904. Because of his editorship for so many years of the Epworth Herald, his residence in Buffalo for the past four years and his home upon Chautauqua Lake, Bishop Berry is well known to many Chautauquans.

JOSEPH F. BERRY

Bishop Joseph F. Berry is a native of Canada. His education was received from Milton Academy, Ontario; Lawrence University, and Upper Iowa University. The former University conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Divinity, and the latter the degree of Doctor of Law. He entered the ministry of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1874. After ten years in the pastorate, he became associate editor of "The Michigan Christian Advocate", resigning this position in 1890, when he was appointed Editor of "The Elworth Herald". Fourteen years later, the General Conference of 1904 elected him a Bishop, with episcopal residence at Buffalo, N. York.

At present he is Senior Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, with residence at Philadelphia, Pa.
