Miss Ennice andrew missionery to best for thirty years, said, or at mockfield, Kentucky, August 10, 1872 and died argust 0, 1990, or accomm, kentucky.

Miss Indrov received her education at Logan College, Aussellville, Lentucky, where one was graduated. She chiled for Brazil in September 1907, and remained in missionary service there until April 1937. Throughout the years she gave beautiful and effective service.

She founded Colegio Centensric at Santa Maria, Brazil, and directed its growth and development, with the exception of furloughs, until her retirement. She is remembered for the contribution she made to the advancement of education in Brazil, and was much loved by the many pupils whose lives were enriched through her influence.

The last years of her life were spent at the Rockford Rest Home in Nashville, Tennessee, and Yadon Nursing Home, Moodburn, Kentucky. Funeral services were held August 9, 1956, at the Auburn Methodist Church, Auburn, Kentucky.
