. Correction: The Union American Methodist Episcopal (UAME) Church, mentioned in a UM News Service story printed in the Dec. 3 issue of Newscope, has had a complex history. According to The History of American Methodism, the UAME Church grew out of the Ezion Methodist Episcopal Church (now Ezion-Mt. Carmel UMC), Wilmington, Del., erected in 1805. Ezion was established for the approximately 100 Black members of the predominantly White Asbury Church. The pastors of Asbury maintained supervision of Ezion. In 1813, Peter Spencer led 31 families out of Ezion and formed the African Union (later UAME) Church. William Anderson and Peter Spencer became its first preachers.
