#### Dear Admiral Carroll:

Having completed my summer vacation, I want to follow through on the conversation I had with you several weeks ago about the new web site established by the Interfaith Committee for Nuclear Disarmament, which I chair. It is www.zero-nukes.org. Its purposes are (1) to serve as a depository for statements on nuclear disarmament from religious organizations, military leaders, civil sector organizations, and international bodies and (2) to promote dialogue on how to get to zero nuclear weapons. Please take a look to see what we are doing.

The page on Military Leaders Speak Out contains the December 1996 statement of International Generals and Admirals and the views of yourself, Admirals Gayler, Shanahan, and Turner, Generals Butler, Horner, and Powell, and Commander Robert Green of the Royal Navy. The page on Religious Statements has the statement released at the Washington Cathedral in June 2000, signed by 18 military professionals and 21 religious leaders.

We are now ready to ask military and civilian experts to bring their thinking up-to-date and provide scenarios on how to get to zero, starting where we are now in 2002. We will post these scenarios on our web site. We will also solicit comments on the various proposals and post them.

I ask your help in two ways. First, would you be willing to write a short article on your current thinking about concrete steps for the elimination of nuclear weapons? This might deal with different categories of weapons, priorities for deactivation and dismantlement, and methods of verification. Or however you want to address the issue. We are suggesting around 2,000 words, but we will accept less or more. Instructions for submitting your ideas for posting on our web site are found at http://www.zero-nukes.org/yourfeedback.html.

Second, can you or your associates at CDI help us find contact information for retired generals and admirals who might be willing to offer their ideas on how

to get to zero? I am thinking of persons such as General Horner, Admiral Turner, the military signers of the Cathedral statement, and any other military officers you might suggest.

Even as Iraq is receiving the world's attention for its possible possession of weapons of mass destruction, the huge nuclear arsenals of the United States and Russia and the lesser arsenals of other known possessors remain a major concern for the peace and security of Earth. Your scenario might go to zero or only approach zero if you don't see how to go all the way. You might deal with stages of reduction, categories of weapons, priorities for action, methods of verification, or however you want to address the issue.

The Interfaith Committee for Nuclear Disarmament, which I chair, is creating a new web site: www.zero-nukes.org. Its purposes are (1) to be a source for statements by religious organizations, military leaders, civil-sector organizations, and international bodies on the need to eliminate nuclear weapons and (2) to encourage dialogue on practical steps for achieving zero nuclear weapons.

The web site is a work in process. We have opened our home page, www.zero-nukes.org with linkage to Religious Statements and How to Get to Zero, though both are incomplete. We also have a beginning for statements by military leaders, www.zero-nukes.org/draft/militaryleaders.html.

On the latter we have taken the liberty of drawing on speeches you have made in recent years, and our webmaster has found a couple photos of you to use. Presumably your statements are in the public domain, but we want to be certain that they give a fair presentation of your views. Therefore, we make this draft available to you for review.

On the How to Get to Zero page we will have a section for the current thinking of military professionals, civil experts, and ordinary citizens on how to achieve this goal. We invite you to contribute your current thinking on the practical steps that should be taken to achieve the global elimination of nuclear weapons.

Such a scenario might encompass a sequence for getting rid of different categories of nuclear weapons. It might include some or all of the common elements recommended by the Canberra Commission and other distinguished bodies (see listing on web page). Although we have no prescribed length, the range of 1,000 to 3,000 words might be appropriate, but we would accept longer. We would like submissions to come as Word attachments or similar formats. We reserve the right to edit for length and format. We offer no compensation for such submissions.

Marie,

I bought a larger monitor, which enables me to see our web page in its full width. This permitted me to take a critical look at it. Also I went again to a number of other sites to get a better feel of what they have done. This leads me to offer some suggestions for changes in our home page. I am interested in what you think of them.

- 1. I like the colors of our masthead. I notice that most sites I looked at have narrower mastheads than ours, which may be preferable. Our takes up extra space that might be better used for more visible text at the beginning of each major page. Therefore, I suggest cropping as indicated on the enclosed paste up, and lowering "zero-nukes, etc." In which case the blue sky might start at the horizon beyond the hills rather than having white space.
- 2. Keep "Feedback" on the top line (not like you changed it on the Religious Statement page), but make it "Your Feedback". On the second line, carry the brown to the right margin, as you now do on the home page (but not on the carry over to Religious Statements). Use this redesign at the head of all other major pages.
- 3. Looking at our home page at full width, it feels too crowded to me, as if we are cramming too much together with not enough white space. Also, the quotes from the generals and the Cathedral statement are somewhat lost. This stems from my desire to have the sponsors appear prominently. Now I realize that the short statements deserve higher priority.

Therefore, while keeping the present layout in reserve. I'd like you to try an arrangement as shown on the paste up. That entails: (a) moving the sponsors to lower on the page, (b) placing the quotes from Horner, Powell, the Cathedral statement on the left, but making them wider as indicated. This should make most of this text readable on the initial screen. (c) This will put "All nuclear weapons...." on the right. (d) With "The Story behind our Masthead" and "Photo of Sunflower Planting" below the quotes, it could come out even with "How to submit your ideas."

4. This would place the sponsors below. They can be in double columns. More are expected and can be added later. If you continue to have them in brown, I would like a lighter shade. Presently it is a little difficult to read. The Moderator would be on the right.

I will be interested in your feedback to these ideas.

I'm still struggling with the best way to achieve feedback and receive proposals.

First, let me report that the feedback form works, except it interchanges e-mail and city, as follows:

Comments: You're doing good work.

Second, a proposal doesn't go through because the e-address has nine letters in proposals@zero-nukes.org. Lighthost rejected this as one too many, so I eliminated the final "s" to make it proposal@zero-nukes.org. I thought I communicated that to you. Anyway you need to make this change.

Third, we have two types of responses we want from users: (1) comments on the site and ideas of others and (2) proposals for how to get to zero. For the first we use the Your Feedback page. For the second we have How to Submit Your Ideas on the draft of How to Get to Zero page, but it is missing from the on-line page even though I wanted it there.

As I work with the site, this all seems confusing. So my thought has evolved to handling both on the Your Feedback page and eliminating the entree in How to Get to Zero. I would like your views.

To bring this into focus I have drafted the attached revision of Your Feedback.

As revised the page would provide for (1) "Comments on Ideas of Others" linked to the Feedback Form, (2) "Your Proposal for Getting to Zero Nuclear Weapons" to be submitted to proposal@zero-nukes.org, (3) the Feedback Form, and (4) Compilation of Feedback.

The latter we would keep up to date by posting with the latest comments at the top. I recall that one time you told me there should be an index by month and year at the beginning of this section.

With Your Feedback revised in this manner, on the home page the phrase "How to submit your ideas" would be linked to "Your Proposal for Getting to Zero Nuclear Weapons" on the Your Feedback page.

On the How to Get to Zero page the paragraph under "Scenarios for Reaching Zero" would be changed to read as follows:

In this section we present scenarios for achieving zero nuclear weapons as proposed by military professionals, civilian experts, and ordinary citizens. We invite you to comment on these ideas and to offer your own proposals by going to **Your Feedback**. [link with that page]

How about a small sunflower inset in this paragraph to provide some color?
