

### **Biographical Note**

Allen Howard Godbey (1864-1948), American educator and minister, was born in Cooper County, Missouri on November 21, 1864. He graduated from Morrisville (Missouri) College in 1883.

Godbey was a fellow in Semitics at the University of Chicago from 1902 to 1905 and received his Ph.d. in 1905. He married Emma L. Moreland on June 16, 1892.

Godbey was admitted to the Southwest Missouri Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in 1895, and served as a pastor for the next four years. Later the church transferred him to the St. Louis Annual Conference, where he served for eight more years.

Godbey was a Semitic scholar. He was a member of the American Oriental Society, the Society of Biblical Literature, and most other learned societies that promote biblical and archaeological research. He was the author of *Code of Hammurabi* (with R. F. Harper), *The Lost Tribes, A Myth, New Light on the Old Testament*, and several other books. He also taught mathematics, Latin, and Greek at Morrisville College, and Latin and English at St. Charles (Missouri) College.

Godbey served as principal of the academy at Central College from 1899 to 1902, and as president of Morrisville College from 1906 to 1909. When Duke University established the Duke Divinity School in 1926, Godbey filled the chair of Professor of Old Testament until his retirement in 1932.

At the 1948 General Conference of the Methodist Church, Godbey was crossing the street when a truck hit him. He died a few hours later.

### **Scope Note**

The collection is composed entirely of manuscripts that Godbey either wrote or collected. Most of the manuscripts are in a printed format, but the last one is typed. Many of these manuscripts contain information concerning the ancient Middle East. The manuscripts concern the Hebrew language or particular aspects of ancient Jewish history. However, they also cover New Testament interpretation, church history, and pan-religious ceremonies. Many of Godbey's manuscripts in this collection were published in the Methodist Quarterly Review. Other scholarly journals that published Godbey's work and are found in this collection include *The Monist, The American Journal of Semitic Languages and Literatures*, and *The Biblical World*. Part of Godbey's dissertation, "Notes of Some Officials of the Sargonid Period", can be found here as well.
